**Healthcare Prospector** identifies healthcare providers and other healthcare entities in transition. Coverage includes hospitals, nursing homes, long-term care facilities, physicians' medical groups, ambulatory care and outpatient centers, mental health facilities, healthcare real estate investment trusts (REITs), and medical laboratory and diagnostic imaging services. The HCP is designed to support the marketing programs of professional firms and aid investors in identifying new opportunities and risks with profiles of entities that meet predetermined criteria. Data are compiled weekly and the Prospector is distributed by email every Sunday evening to arrive before 9:00 A.M. every Monday. For each business identified, the Prospector provides the trigger event and enough information to assess the prospect and make an initial evaluation of the opportunity.

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## Prospector Profile Categories

In order to appear in the **Healthcare Prospector**, an event occurs or is reported which, in the opinion of the editors, might have a material or significant impact on the company. In cases where an event had previously been reported and there is a new development that the editors believe is important related to that event, the new development will be reported in the Prospector. The reported events are categorized as follows:

1. **Labor.** The entity is reported to have a significant staff, labor, or employment issue. Events reported include the election of a new senior officer or director, the termination of a physician or suspension of privileges, and a strike, labor unrest, or a union organizing campaign.
2. **Finance.** An event that results in or may result in a material change in the entity's financial condition.
3. **Transaction.** The entity is reported to be involved in a significant merger, acquisition, alliance, venture, asset purchase or sale, joint venture, and expansion or closure of services or facility.
4. **Litigation.** The entity is a party to, threatens, or is threatened with significant litigation or claims. Events reported include criminal felony charges filed against a company or officer, director, or physician; a class action suit; an internal investigation; and an anti-trust claim.
5. **Regulatory Issue.** The entity is reported to have a significant federal or state regulatory issue or JCAHO issue that will have or may have a significant impact on the entity.
6. **Miscellaneous.** Some other event is reported which, in the opinion of the editors, may have a significant impact on the profiled entity.

**DISCLAIMER:** The conditions for inclusion in the Prospector are selected by the editors because, in their opinion, the occurrence of such an event or the existence of such a circumstance may have a significant or material impact on the business. **Event:** Advocat has signed an agreement to extend the lease of four nursing homes in Florida for an additional term of four years. The lease was to expire December 31, 2005. Under the new agreement, the lease term was extended through February 2010. The four nursing homes are subject to mortgages held by Omega Healthcare Investors.

In a separate event, the Company announced that an agreement to sell one assisted living facility in North Carolina was terminated by the buyer. The facility is unrelated to the previously announced transaction to sell 11 assisted living facilities in North Carolina to Agemark Acquisition, LLC. Advocat will continue to list the single facility for sale and expects the transaction with Agemark to close sometime during the first quarter of 2006.

**Description:** The Company provides long-term care services to the elderly including assisted living, skilled nursing and ancillary healthcare services. **Event:** Amedisys has acquired seven home health agencies from ASAP Health Services, a division of The Schuster Group, effective January 1. The agencies, all located in Central Oklahoma, are expected to contribute around \$4.0 million in annualized revenues, but are not expected to add materially to earnings in 2006. They were purchased for \$2.1 million in cash and a \$0.6 million promissory note payable over three years.

The Company has closed its previously announced acquisition of an Oklahoma-based therapy staffing company. After pre-closing adjustments, the total price for this deal was \$2.5 million, of which \$0.5 million was paid in November, with the balance paid at closing in a combination of \$1.25 million in cash and a \$0.75 million promissory note payable over three years. Subsequent to the closing, Arthur Hulbert, controlling stockholder and the president of Hulbert Therapy Services, P.C., will join Amedisys as its new Vice President of Therapy Services. Initially, Amedisys' therapy staffing division will have offices in Eastern Oklahoma and Western Arkansas, the previous operating locations of Hulbert Therapy Services.

**Event:** Fitch Ratings has assigned an underlying rating of 'A+' to the \$53.125 million Massachusetts Health and Educational Facilities Authority revenue bonds series 2006, issued for the Dartmouth-Hitchcock Alliance Obligated Group, which is composed of the Mary Hitchcock Memorial Hospital, the Dartmouth-Hitchcock Clinic, Central Vermont Medical Center and Cooley Dickinson Hospital. Fitch has also affirmed the underlying 'A+' rating on the nearly \$422.8 million outstanding bond debt of Dartmouth-Hitchcock's Obligated Group. The rating outlook is stable.

Bond proceeds will be used to refund the series B Massachusetts Health and Educational Facilities Authority revenue bonds issued to Cooley Dickinson Hospital; finance a portion of the construction and furnishing costs of a new 117,690-square-foot surgery bed tower at Cooley Dickinson Hospital; and pay the costs of issuance. Bonds are expected to be priced the week of January 16 via negotiation by Morgan Stanley & Co. Incorporated.

**Event:** The U.S. District Court for the Southern District of Texas has yet to rule on Dynacq Healthcare's motion to dismiss the consolidated securities class action filed against it and certain of its current and former officers and directors. The cases were filed as class actions brought on behalf of persons who purchased shares of Company common stock in the open market generally during the period of January 14, 2003 through December 18, 2003.

The Company filed a motion to dismiss all or some of the claims in October 2004. The non-evidentiary oral argument was held on May 13, 2005. The plaintiffs voluntarily dismissed two of the former officers from the case. The court dismissed the claims against one former officer and Ernst & Young, LLP, but denied the motions to dismiss of the Company and two current officers who were defendants. The Company and those two officers have filed a motion to reconsider the order and/or motion for leave to conduct an interlocutory appeal from the denial of their motions to dismiss. The court has not ruled on this motion.

**Description:** The Company develops and manages general acute care hospitals that principally provide specialized surgeries such as bariatric, orthopedic and neuro-spine surgeries. Certain of its facilities also provide fertility, sleep laboratory and pain management services, as well as minor emergency treatment services and ear, nose and throat services.

**Event:** After nearly a year of financial battle with Erie County Medical Center, Erie County lawmakers approved a four-year fiscal support package for the hospital. The settlement allocates \$48 million in county dollars to the hospital between 2006 and 2009 plus another \$41.5 million in bonded capital improvement costs.

The county owned the hospital until two years ago. Litigation on how much public sector financial support is due to the hospital has ended with the State Supreme Court ruling that the county is obligated to provide subsidies to the hospital based on provisions included in the 2004 spin-off deal that saw the hospital become a quasi-stand alone private corporation.
