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Healthcare Prospector identifies healthcare providers and other healthcare entities in transition. Coverage includes hospitals, nursing homes, long-term care facilities, physicians' medical groups, ambulatory care and outpatient centers, mental health facilities, healthcare real estate investment trusts (REITs), and medical laboratory and diagnostic imaging services. The HCP is designed to support the marketing programs of professional firms and aid investors in identifying new opportunities and risks with profiles of entities that meet predetermined criteria. Data are compiled weekly and the Prospector is distributed by email every Sunday evening to arrive before 9:00 A.M. every Monday. For each business identified, the Prospector provides the trigger event and enough information to assess the prospect and make an initial evaluation of the opportunity.

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Prospector Profile Categories

In order to appear in the **Healthcare Prospector**, an event occurs or is reported which, in the opinion of the editors, might have a material or significant impact on the company. In cases where an event had previously been reported and there is a new development that the editors believe is important related to that event, the new development will be reported in the Prospector. The reported events are categorized as follows:

1. **Labor.** The entity is reported to have a significant staff, labor, or employment issue. Events reported include the election of a new senior officer or director, the termination of a physician or suspension of privileges, and a strike, labor unrest, or a union organizing campaign.
2. **Finance.** An event that results in or may result in a material change in the entity's financial condition.
3. **Transaction.** The entity is reported to be involved in a significant merger, acquisition, alliance, venture, asset purchase or sale, joint venture, and expansion or closure of services or facility.
4. **Litigation.** The entity is a party to, threatens, or is threatened with significant litigation or claims. Events reported include criminal felony charges filed against a company or officer, director, or physician; a class action suit; an internal investigation; and an anti-trust claim.
5. **Regulatory Issue.** The entity is reported to have a significant federal or state regulatory issue or JCAHO issue that will have or may have a significant impact on the entity.
6. **Miscellaneous.** Some other event is reported which, in the opinion of the editors, may have a significant impact on the profiled entity.

DISCLAIMER: The conditions for inclusion in the Prospector are selected by the editors because, in their opinion, the occurrence of such an event or the existence of such a circumstance may have a significant or material impact on the business. Event: Moody's Investors Service has assigned A2 underlying ratings to Adventist Health System's \$171.91 million series 2006A and B Hospital Revenue Refunding Bonds. The rating outlook is stable. The series 2006A bonds will be insured by FSA with a standby bond purchase agreement from Dexia Credit Local. The series 2006B bonds will be insured by FGIC with a standby bond purchase agreement from Dexia Credit Local. Bond proceeds will be used to advance refund Adventist's series 2001-A bonds and pay costs of issuance.

In addition, Moody's affirmed its A2 and A2/VMIG1 bond ratings on Adventist's \$2.7 billion outstanding debt. It also affirmed its A3 rating on Adventist's subordinate debt: \$29 million outstanding Adventist Health System Capital Trust I Series A (1997) Capital Securities.

Event: America Service Group has filed with the Securities and Exchange Commission its restated audited consolidated financial statements for the years ended December 31, 2003 and 2004 and restated selected financial data for the years ended December 31, 2001 and 2002 as well as certain unaudited condensed consolidated financial information for the first and second quarters of 2005. Event: Moody's Investors Service has assigned a P-1 rating to Ascension Health's \$250 million Taxable Extendible Commercial Paper Notes. Proceeds of this program will be used primarily for liquidity support for outstanding variable rate demand obligations that are subject to short-term remarketing agreements and for acquisition funding.

Ascension Health's long-term senior bond rating of Aa2 and long-term subordinated bond rating of Aa3 were affirmed on February 22. The long-term rating outlook is stable. The health system has \$4 billion of outstanding rated debt.

Event: Wisconsin Physicians Service Insurance Corp. has filed a broad antitrust lawsuit against Aurora Health Care. According to the suit, the healthcare system's dominance in the Milwaukee hospital market is driving up health-insurance premiums throughout eastern Wisconsin. Aurora sued the insurance company in late December for not including its hospitals in certain of its plans, which it claims to be a violation to their 2001 contract. The insurance company filed a counterclaim, accusing Aurora of using its dominance to force insurers to include Aurora hospitals in every plan they sell thus preventing the insurers from offering less costly options.

Event: Standard & Poor's Ratings Services has assigned an 'A' rating to the Heber Springs, Arkansas Hospital and Health Care Facilities Board's \$21.7 million series 2006 bonds, issued for Baptist Health. The outlook is stable. Bond proceeds will be used to finance a replacement facility for the health system's 25-bed critical access hospital, Baptist Health Medical Center-Heber Springs. Event: Lowndes County supervisors have accepted Baptist Memorial Health Care's \$30 million offer to buy the Baptist Memorial Hospital-Golden Triangle facility, which the county owns. The 328-bed hospital is located in Columbus, Mississippi, and is the health system's largest regional hospital. The county supervisors, however, have additional requests. One proposal would require the health system to spend at least \$40 million during the next 20 years to improve the hospital. The supervisors also want the health system to continue its physician-recruitment efforts and funding and enhancements for the nursing program at Mississippi University for Women. They also proposed that the current level of ambulance services in the hospital will be maintained within six months of closing the purchase then evaluate the scope of ambulance services in the county.
