Event: Abbott Northwestern Hospital has been awarded Primary Stroke Center Certification and the Gold Seal of Approval by the Joint Commission Accreditation on Healthcare Organization after an on-site review was conducted earlier this year. The Abbott Northwestern stroke program has consistently demonstrated a lower than expected mortality rate, despite being a referral site for the most severe strokes. The certification is based on the recommendations for primary stroke centers published by the Brain Attack Coalition and the American Stroke Association's statements and guidelines for stroke care. The Joint Commission launched the program, the nation's first, in 2003.

Description: Abbott Northwestern Hospital, part of Allina Hospitals and Clinics, is the largest not-for-profit hospital in the Twin Cities area. It includes the Virginia Piper Cancer Institute and is one of the four hospital-based locations of the Sister Kenny Rehabilitation Institute.

Event: Advocat has entered into a commitment with Capmark Finance, Inc. for a comprehensive refinancing of the Company's long-term debt. Under the terms of the commitment, Capmark will provide mortgage debt of about \$22.5 million with a 5-year maturity and a term note of about \$8.1 million with a 4-year maturity to refinance the Company's remaining mortgage and bank term debt. Final terms remain subject to negotiation, and the transaction is expected to close during the third quarter of 2006.

Event: Baker County Medical Services' Ed Fraser Memorial Hospital has filed a suit against two national health insurance giants hoping to get judicial clarification on a state law concerning how "usual and customary" charges are determined for out-of-network providers. The hospital filed against Aetna Health Management LLC and Humana Medical Plan, Inc. after neither side could agree on payment prices or what constitutes "usual and customary provider charges" or the term "community" in a 2005 Florida statute. The suit was filed May 30 in the 8th Judicial Circuit court for Baker County.

Event: Workers at Columbia Memorial Hospital have agreed to stand down from a strike after U.S. Senator Hillary Clinton interceded in the labor dispute at the Hudson hospital. More than 600 Columbia Memorial employees, members of 1199 of the Service Employees International Union, have been working without a contract since December 31, 2005. In late June, they voted to strike beginning July 5, unless management bargained to resolve what the union sees as serious outstanding issues regarding patient care standards. The unionized workers include registered nurses, pharmacists, medical technicians, technologists, housekeeping and dietary workers. Workers and management at the hospital have reached a tentative agreement on a new contract and now are working on a memorandum of understanding to be ratified by union members in mid-July.
