Healthcare Prospector identifies healthcare providers and other healthcare entities in transition. Coverage includes hospitals, nursing homes, long-term care facilities, physicians' medical groups, ambulatory care and outpatient centers, mental health facilities, healthcare real estate investment trusts (REITs), and medical laboratory and diagnostic imaging services. The HCP is designed to support the marketing programs of professional firms and aid investors in identifying new opportunities and risks with profiles of entities that meet predetermined criteria. Data are compiled weekly and the Prospector is distributed by email every Sunday evening to arrive before 9:00 A.M. every Monday. For each business identified, the Prospector provides the trigger event and enough information to assess the prospect and make an initial evaluation of the opportunity.

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Prospector Profile Categories

In order to appear in the **Healthcare Prospector**, an event occurs or is reported which, in the opinion of the editors, might have a material or significant impact on the company. In cases where an event had previously been reported and there is a new development that the editors believe is important related to that event, the new development will be reported in the Prospector. The reported events are categorized as follows:

1. **Labor.** The entity is reported to have a significant staff, labor, or employment issue. Events reported include the election of a new senior officer or director, the termination of a physician or suspension of privileges, and a strike, labor unrest, or a union organizing campaign.
2. **Finance.** An event that results in or may result in a material change in the entity's financial condition.
3. **Transaction.** The entity is reported to be involved in a significant merger, acquisition, alliance, venture, asset purchase or sale, joint venture, and expansion or closure of services or facility.
4. **Litigation.** The entity is a party to, threatens, or is threatened with significant litigation or claims. Events reported include criminal felony charges filed against a company or officer, director, or physician; a class action suit; an internal investigation; and an anti-trust claim.
5. **Regulatory Issue.** The entity is reported to have a significant federal or state regulatory issue or JCAHO issue that will have or may have a significant impact on the entity.
6. **Miscellaneous.** Some other event is reported which, in the opinion of the editors, may have a significant impact on the profiled entity.

DISCLAIMER: The conditions for inclusion in the Prospector are selected by the editors because, in their opinion, the occurrence of such an event or the existence of such a circumstance may have a significant or material impact on the business. Event: State regulators have approved Alamance Regional Medical Center's plans to build an outpatient center and medical office in Mebane. The \$19.3 million project will include ambulatory surgery, urgent care, and diagnostic imaging, as well as physician offices. It will be part of a \$116 million mixed-use development planned for the former Arrowhead Golf Club site. The project was delayed after initially winning approval from the state's certificate of need section, which must give its approval to large health care facility investments, because the hospital decided to change the ownership structure of the project. The building will be owned by a separate corporation that Alamance Regional will have a majority stake in, but physicians will also be given the chance to buy into the project.

Description: Private, not-for-profit Alamance Regional Medical Center offers cancer care, behavioral health, rehabilitation, cardiology, and home health care and provides a sleep lab, pain center, and nursing home.

Event: The Minneapolis Heart Institute, a part of Allina Hospitals & Clinics that provides heart-attack specialists for partnering hospitals, is expanding its services to include diagnosis and treatment of aortic dissections, a potentially fatal heart defect. The program will allow six regional hospitals to send images of the heart via CT scans to cardiologists at the Heart Institute to determine if a patient has a rip in the wall of the aorta, a large blood vessel in the heart. If aortic dissection is confirmed, the hospitals can rush patients to the Heart Institute by ambulance or helicopter for emergency surgery. Six hospitals are in the program, Cambridge Medical Center; Hutchinson Community Hospital; St. Francis Regional Medical Center; Douglas County Hospital; Northfield Hospital; and Ridgeview Medical Center.

Event: Baptist Health System is plotting a \$114 million expansion of Wolfson Children's Hospital, a project that will generate about 110 jobs. The expansion of the region's only children's hospital is part of a \$400 million, 5-year capital budget approved by Baptist's board. Event: Centinela Freeman HealthSystem plans to close the emergency room at its Memorial campus, despite opposition from Inglewood officials and community members. Centinela Freeman officials are filing plans with Los Angeles County to combine Memorial's emergency department with the one at the Centinela campus about one and a half miles away. In place of the Memorial emergency department, an urgent care facility will open to handle non-emergency cases. Another urgent care center will open on the Centinela campus in November. Event: United States District Judge for the Northern District of Texas, Jorge A. Solis, has ruled against Presbyterian Hospital of Dallas and three cardiologists who sought a new trial to reverse a \$366 million jury verdict levied against them. In ruling in favor of Dallas cardiologist Dr. Lawrence R. Poliner, Judge Solis reduced the overall damage award to \$22.54 million but rejected an appeal by defendants seeking to reduce the overall damage award to less than \$1 million. Dr. Poliner, who opened an office in the professional building at Presbyterian, claims in his lawsuit that unfounded concerns surfaced about his clinical skills and judgment, all in an effort to have him removed from the staff. The concerns ultimately resulted in a suspension of his cardiac catheterization privileges, effectively denying him the ability to treat his patients or attract new ones. Jurors originally awarded Dr. Poliner \$161 million against Presbyterian Hospital; \$141 million against Dr. James Knochel, Presbyterian's internal medicine chairman; and \$32 million each against Dr. John Harper, chief of cardiology, and Dr. Charles Levin, head of the cardiac catheterization lab.
