Prospector Profile Categories

In order to appear in the **Healthcare Prospector**, an event occurs or is reported which, in the opinion of the editors, might have a material or significant impact on the company. In cases where an event had previously been reported and there is a new development that the editors believe is important related to that event, the new development will be reported in the Prospector. The reported events are categorized as follows:

1. **Labor.** The entity is reported to have a significant staff, labor, or employment issue. Events reported include the election of a new senior officer or director, the termination of a physician or suspension of privileges, and a strike, labor unrest, or a union organizing campaign.
2. **Finance.** An event that results in or may result in a material change in the entity's financial condition.

Event: Advocat and Omega Healthcare Investors have agreed to amend and renew the master lease covering 29 nursing centers. The initial term of the lease was set to expire in September 2010, with a 10-year renewal option. The amended master lease commences on October 1, 2006, and extends to September 30, 2018. The amendment also provides for a renewal option of an additional 12 years. Consistent with prior terms, the lease provides for annual increases in lease payments equal to the lesser of two times the increase in the consumer price index or 3.0%. Under generally accepted accounting principles, the Company is required to record these scheduled rent increases on a straight-line basis over the 12-year term of the renewal period. As a result of recording these increases, the Company's annual rent expense will increase by about \$2.7 million, although this increase has no effect on cash rent payments other than the payments associated with the restructuring of the preferred stock described above.

Event: Advocat has entered into an agreement to restructure its series B redeemable convertible preferred stock held by Omega Healthcare Investors, a publicly owned REIT, eliminating the option of Omega to convert the preferred stock into shares of Advocat common stock. The convertible series B preferred stock held by Omega will be exchanged for a new series C preferred stock that is not convertible. The new series C preferred stock has a stated value of about \$4.9 million and an annual dividend rate of 7% of its stated value, similar to the terms of the series B preferred stock. The series C preferred stock will pay dividends in cash quarterly. The series C preferred stock is redeemable at stated value at Omega's option after September 30, 2010, and is redeemable at stated value at Advocat's option, subject to certain limitations.

The vision for the healthcare campus started in 1999 with Owatonna Clinic’s construction plans for the new 26th Street Clinic and the purchase of additional land to accommodate an integrated healthcare campus. Event: Baptist Medical Center Downtown's Life Flight is the first air ambulance service in Florida to be accredited by the Commission on the Accreditation of Medical Transport Systems. The 3-year voluntary accreditation follows a site visit and a review by commission staff of Life Flight documentation, including education, safety, patient care, and helicopter maintenance schedules. Life Flight was started in 1980 and uses a two-engine helicopter as a self-contained critical care unit. It is available 24 hours a day for patients within a 150-mile radius of Baptist's Downtown campus.

Event: Carraway Methodist Medical Center and its debtor-affiliates asked Judge Tamara O. Mitchell of the U.S. Bankruptcy Court for the Northern District of Alabama for authority to sell substantially all of their assets free and clear of all liens, claims, and encumbrances through an auction on November 7. The Debtors also want to assume and assign some executory contracts and unexpired leases to the highest bidder. The Debtors further asked the Court's approval on the sale following the auction. Judge Mitchell will convene a sale hearing on November 8. Judge Mitchell has approved the Debtors' bidding procedures for the auction of substantially all of their assets. Bids must actually be received on November 3.

Event: Cogdell Spencer broke ground on the Lancaster General Health Campus Medical Office Building at the Lancaster General Health Campus. The 64,070 square foot facility will be owned by Cogdell Spencer and various physician tenants occupying space in the building.
